Six test +ve for Covid in Abohar

ABOHAR, APRIL 12
In view of the increasing Covid cases across the country, testing of patients has been intensified at the Civil Hospital here.

Sources said samples of at least 500 suspected patients were collected at the hospital during the last 10 days out of which six were found Covid positive. These patients had been isolated at their homes. Out of these, test of three patients were conducted by private labs and two were by the Army and one by the BSF hospitals.

Health workers said that all Covid patients were under their supervision.

Paediatrician Dr Sahib Ram said for the past few days the number of children suffering from cold and cough arriving at the Civil Hospital had increased. He said samples of 20 children were being collected every day to check if they were Covid positive.

The hospital authorities have appealed to parents to not to send their children to crowded areas and get them checked at the hospital if they showed Covid symptoms.

STPs ineffective, dirty water flows into Buddha Nullah

LUDHIANA, APRIL 12
Despite toxic waste of red-category industries of dyeing and electroplating treated by sewage treatment plants (STPs) not meeting standards, water from them is being diverted to the Buddha Nullah, which is one of the most polluted drains in the state.

Ludhiana city has three treatment plants at Bhattian, Jarnalpur and Balloke.

Residents living along the Buddha Nullah are unhappy that the STPs are ineffective and are discharging polluted water. Avtar Singh of Hainawal Puli said, "We are breathing and living on toxic and human waste."

Balbir Chand of Humbran Road said, "The Buddha Nullah has affected crops in adjoining areas."

In 2021, the National Green Tribunal twice imposed penalties, amounting to Rs 56 lakh and Rs 46 lakh, on the Ludhiana Municipal Corporation for failing to treat

The Punjab and Haryana High Court has directed the Punjab Chief Secretary to file an affidavit specifying whether a system is in place for imparting training to the officers exercising statutory powers, apart from the generalised training at the State Institute of Public Administration, Chandigarh.
